

KEYBOARD MARATHON MAN RAISES CASH FOR CHURCH

A FORMER jazz musician staged a 24-hour keyboard recital at the John Grose dealership, Ransomes Europark, Ipswich, to raise money towards keeping his local church open.

Peter Day, 50, of Clopton, was kept going by the support of friends, parishioners of the church in Clopton St Mary and a "jam session" in the early hours with his brother, Keith, on saxophone.

Mr Day, whose marathon started at 6pm on Friday and ended at 5pm on Saturday, said he felt better than he had expected to afterwards.

"There were a couple of low points in the early hours, but I had company all night and that helped," he said.

He is aiming to raise £3,000 to save the 700 year-old church from falling into disrepair and being forced to close.

"It is the last remaining focal point of the old village and if forced to close, everything it stands for would go to rack and ruin," he said.
