NEW RECTOR OF CLOPTON-WITH-DEBACH.

INSTITUTION BY THE BISHOP.

The collation and induction of the Rev. J. A. S. Large as rector of Clopton-with-Debach, took place before a large congregation, including friends from former parishes. The new Rector, who comes from Somersham-with-Flowton, was ordained by the late Bishop of Worcester in Worcester Cathedral in 1912, and held curacies at St. Paul's, Blackheath, Birmingham, Fladbury, near Pershore. In 1918 he became curate-in-charge of Crowfield, and rector of Flowton and Willisham in 1922.

The Bishop of St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich performed the institution, and the Rev. E. Sutton, rector of Grundisburgh, the induction. The robed clergy present were: The Rev. Canon Page, who recently resigned the living; the Rev. Canon Eddowes, R.D. (Kelsale), the Rev. Canon Wonnacott, R.D. (Stonham Aspal), the Revs. S. H. De La Bere (Barking), A. J. Treloar (Bramford), H. A. Fleetwood (Creeting), A. A. L. Gedge (Earl Stonham), H. A. Lewby (Mickfield), F. Mitton (Bealings), G. M. Shellard (Burgh St. Andrew), E. L. Collins (Otley), F. S. Keane (Swilland), W. H. Lilley (Wetheringsett), S. Osborne (Charsfield), W. Bonney (Monewden), and — Jones (curate of Woodbridge).

When the new Rector had been instituted, he and the Rev. E. Sutton were conducted by the churchwardens (Mr. A. J. Coppen and Mrs. Sidebottom) to the church door, where the hand of the priest was laid upon the key of the door. He then tolled the bell, and was finally conducted to the Rector's stall. After the ceremony, tea was provided by Mrs. Sidebottom (churchwarden).

NEW RURAL DEAN OF CARLFORD
