Public Rights of Way

Clopton Commercial Park/Airfield – This is ongoing nothing new to report.

Clopton's reduced bus service – A resident has brought to the council's attention that the bus service has been reduced. The reduced service makes it only really a viable service for people who want to travel to Ipswich during normal work or education commuting hours, the timetable does not allow for part day visits such as medical visits or shopping trips. There is no same day return service anymore from Clopton to Woodbridge. Suffolk County Council have explained that this is due to the minimal usage of the bus service, they are not able to justify running buses that are not used.

There is a service called connecting communities, when you need to make a journey within Suffolk Coastal District and there is no public transport you can make an advanced booking to be picked up and dropped off to an appropriate bus or train link point for onward travel or in some instances to your end destination if there is no transport link. This service is charged based on an average bus fare for journeys of the equivalent distance. It does have to be

booked in advance so cannot be a spur of the moment thing and you will have to know what time you wish to travel both ways in advance. Anglia EPC have been paid £300 – This payment was made between meetings as it was required within a week of the service. The service itself was approved at the last meeting.

Bank reconciliation check – Cllr. Pitt has checked and approved the bank reconciliation in advance of the meeting.

Initial consideration of 2020/21 Parish Council budget.

It is estimated that in financial year 2020/21 we will be over budget by £1094.

This is due to having not budgeted for the expenses associated with the new lease for the village hall, as shown in minutes of previous meetings. The anticipated costs associated with the lease are £1934 in total which will have to be taken from the general reserves. We anticipate however to be under budget on several items on the budget to the tune of around £850 this is largely due to reduced activities because of Covid 19 restrictions.

The 2021/22 draft budget allows for a small percentage increase in the usual annual payments it also includes a payment of £180 to go into a new earmarked fund for Village Hall expenses, this will be set up as a fund to save for the next lease renewal in 2045 and as a buffer for any unexpected costs associated with the Village Hall.

The budget draft allows for £4750 expenditure

Clerks salary scales

NALC have now agreed this financial years Clerks payscales. This has resulted in an increase of salary for the Clerk of 27p per hour bringing the hourly rate up to £10.04. Back pay has been applied on the October salary as this change is backdated to 1st April 2020
