Planning applications received:	
DC/24/2573/FUL: Construction of stables and an all-weather riding arena,	
associated groundwork and fencing. High House Farm, Shop Road, Clopton,	
Woodbridge, Suffolk IP13 6QP. Deadline 27 th August 2024.	
The PC invited the applicants to present details of the application, and answer any	
questions.	
Cllr Raffell was given clarification on the route of the footpath running between the	
house and stables. JD said that the plans should show the legal route of the path	
as well as the new route. It was noted that a temporary diversion would be in place	
during construction, and a separate application to seek permanent diversion of the	
footpath. A notice of public path order under the Town and Country Planning Act	
1990 would be required, and the new route must be safe and not diminish the	
amenity of using the path. The applicants confirmed that Sharon Berry, Public	
Rights of Way Officer, had been engaged for this (Transaction ID 697-76501).	
Cllr Tiley-Nunn queried drainage details; water harvesting is into an attenuation	
tank with an overflow into a soakaway. ~85% of water drains through the horse	
menage with typically nothing going into the soakaway. There had been no sign of	
any run-off from inside the stables. Horse manure would be trailered away.	
Buildings would be painted black in keeping with neighbouring buildings.	
The PC suggested that, for a period of 5 years, any hedging that dies should be	
replaced during the hedging season. The applicants agreed although preferably	
not as a condition of the planning permission as it had an impact on grants.	
The PC noted Suffolk Highways' consultee comment applying 60mph speed limit	
criteria for the access visibility splays, although the applicants were sure this wasn't	
an issue anyway.	

In summary the PC unanimously agreed to support the application.	Clerk to submit

CPC095/24 Correspondence Tour of Britain, ToB (8th September in East Suffolk) The Parish Council noted East Suffolk Council's (ESC) Economic Development team potential grant of up to £500 for community activity promoting the ToB although the deadline was 7th August, later extended to 20th August but already passed. Competitors likely to travel through Clopton between 2-2.45pm, Sunday 8th Sept. Cllr Tiley-Nunn said that he'd responded to ESC's request for contact details of a land owner* to ask permission to install a temporary 3.55m x 1m road safety banner during the Tour of Britain period, but had yet to receive a reply.
